Westerweller Buildings (Hilliard TV and Adjacent Residence)

4009 and 4005 Main Street (Map No. 2 & 3)

This small brick cottage and adjacent brick commercial building were built of 1860-65 and occupied by John Westerweller, a farmer. Westerweller lived in the residence and may have sold his farm produce or other merchandise out of the adjacent building. In 1872, the local Masonic chapter added a second story to the store building for use as a meeting hall. The building later served as an early location for the Merchants and Farmers Bank when it was formed in 1903. Architecturally, the two (2) buildings complement each other in their brick construction and round-headed windows. The store building has had a new storefront and side addition, but the residential building remains intact.
